

Why is there Political Unrest in Haiti? By: Peggy & Sebastion Lucien

Let's start with the poverty in Haiti. The national poverty rate is 58.6% in comparison with the United States at 12.3% (US Census Sept 2018). The average annual income is \$1,793.55 US in Haiti while in the United States it's \$59,039. In Montrouis, Haiti many people don't have the opportunity to work. I personally know educated, driven people in Haiti that can't find work.

The value of the dollar in Haiti is currently about 15.5 US dollars to 1 Haitian dollar. The inflation rate has risen from 7.52% in 2015 to a concerning 13.27% in 2018; yet the people are making the same amount of money.

Now let's add the cost of fuel into the picture. The cost of gas, on average, is \$3.04 per gallon. The government of Haiti entered into an agreement with the IMF (International Monetary Fund) to receive assistance. The IMF in turn told the Haitian government they need to increase their fuel prices. The Haitian government took the advice and immediately increased gasoline by 38%; \$4.20 per gallon and diesel by 47%! We as Americans would be protesting too; yet, we are earning more money than the average Haitian.

Now, imagine STRUGGLING to provide one meal for your child a day, sleeping in a 20' X 30' hut with up to 6 people on the dirt floor, trying to make just a little money to survive. Many Haitians do this by providing tap tap rides or rides on motorcycles for a few pennies in U.S. dollars. People can only be pushed so far before they just can't tolerate it anymore.

The most effective way to understand just how hard it is for the Haitian people is to think about the one thing almost every person in Haiti I've spoken to can relate....When they were young and hungry, and their mother's didn't have anything to give them, their moms put a touch of salt under their tongue to trick their stomachs into thinking they ate. This would stop the pain in their stomachs that most of us have and thankfully will never experience.

Clinic Corner



Noel Mickelange, prefers the new medical clinic because the rooms are more comfortable. A laboratory and more services such as maternity and dental care are expected in the new medical clinic.
